

## FRAMESET PRACTISE

Your task is to recreate an actual site (below) using Framesets. This will take you through a lot of the basic practical steps you will use in creating your own site. All of the images you require are provided in the images folder.




1. In Dreamweaver create a Frameset document choosing the appropriate layout from the preset menu.
2. Save the frameset document and each frame when prompted by Dreamweaver. Remember to **Save All**. You should end up with **4 different documents**: The Main Frameset Document, The top frame, the side frame and the main frame. Remember these last three are 3 separate html documents.
3. Now you can begin to layout each frame paying attention to the features of the original.
4. For the Side frame you will need to provide links and **TARGET them** to open further pages in the main frame section.
5. Text for the site is provided in the WebpageText file – you will need to format this.
6. To get each frame the right size you can either drag to fit or open the Frameset document in a text editor e.g. wordPad and enter exact values.

## Questions:

### Q: How do I know what size to give each frame?

A: Open the main banner graphic in Photoshop. Check Image>Image Size , the height of the graphic will give you the exact pixel height of the Top Frame.

### Q: How do I match the colour of the graphic to the background?

A: Again , go to Photoshop and use the eyedropper tool >  to sample the blue area of the banner graphic.



Now click on that colour in the colour selector >

This will open the colour palette and give you the correct hex code colour( e.g. #000fff). This is the background colour you will use for the Side Frame.

### Q: How do I get the text to align as shown?

A: As in a word Processing program, this is a setting for Justified text which you can apply to selected paragraphs
